
<u>COMMANDER'S CORNER</u> Robert Seibert

I want to thank everyone who participated and attended our Four Chaplain service. We had great attendance.

I am happy we honored those who help start the Tri-State Chaplains Corp Veterans Missions Council. We are truly blessed to have this group and I hope we can encourage others to follow their example and establish others throughout the country.

f you haven't heard, we are looking for a post home that is ours to do with as we want. Since the renovation of the community room we have been limited to only putting things on the front wall. This limits what can even be put up. We also are limited in planning events since we do not control the schedule of the community room. Along with this, our office space for keeping records, honor guard supplies and other things has been greatly reduced. If you know of a

building that could house us or of land we could build on, or just someone who needs to get rid of money, please let me know. You may or may not know, but my wife and I adopted 6 boys years ago. Of the six, three have been in the military and a fourth is in the process of enlisting. The first son enlisted in the Marines. Even though we told the recruiter he had bad knees, the recruited said, "Let's let the find that out." They did. Due to his knees it took him over month longer in basic due to being placed on light duty. Once finished with basic he finished his 4 year career on light duty and was medically retired. He said the only time his knees didn't hurt was when he was drinking. New Year's eve, 9 years ago, he drank himself to death. The next son also joined the Marines. I'm not exactly sure why he was discharged because he's never given a straight answer. At some point he got into drugs,



again not exactly sure when. After a divorce and rehab he found a friend who became his wife. Then, this passed Christmas something happened and he decided to kill himself. The first attempt was unsuccessful because the gun wasn't loaded. His wife sold the gun the next day. So the second attempt was to drive off in the creek and drown. We a lot of alcohol for courage, he wasn't sober enough to drive the last 100 feet. Blessed by God I found him. The third son joined the Army. He is a combat veteran medic. Two years ago he called to let us know he just got out of the hospital, because his roommates found him with his gun to his head. I'm not going to tell you the military was these boys only problems, it wasn't. However, this gives you an idea of why the Be the One campaign is important to me. We need to bring suicide awareness out in the open. We need to help veterans / people understand it is ok to ask for help, it is okay to get help, help is available and it is not unusual

to need help. On April 29 we are having a 2.2 mile walk to raise awareness. Please consider what part you can play in helping to make this a success. If you want more information contact myself, Phil or Michelle. I hope you are planning to be at

our next post meeting. Rob Holder, whose late father-in-law was a past post commander in New Orleans, will be helping us have a low country cookout.

Shortly after graduating from high school Gunny joined the Marine Corps in '75 and his life was forever changed being filled with adventure and accomplishment. Gunny's adventure began by enjoyed boot camp in a lovely vacation spot know as "Paradise" Pairrs Island, Upon completion of boot camp, he received orders to First Battalion Second Marines, Camp Lejeune. Gunny began an extensive training program honing his skills, mastering multiple weapons systems including antitank weapons, multi shot flame weapon, LAAW rockets, M106 recoilless rifle and demolitions. Proficient in these skills, Gunny received orders for a relaxing 3month cruise to Viegas PR, San Juan and Saint Thomas in the Caribbean on a luxurious amphibious Navy ship with all

the amenities of a "Gator Freighter". Completing this cruise, Gunny was off to Forth Drum, for a grueling six weeks of Cold Weather Training, then back to MCAS Cherry Point for Search and Rescue school training (SERS), then back to Camp Lejeune for a Battalion (BN) march from Camp Lejeune to Fort Bragg, fortunately the BN, was transported back to Camp Lejeune by truck. Gunny was promoted to the rank of Corporal, got married and received orders to recruiter school in San Diego CA. Upon completion of Recruiter's School, he was stationed in the Boston area for recruiting duty. Gunny's career and training spans an immense array of knowledge and skills. He was assigned to MCB Pickle Meadows in the beautiful High Sierra in CA. Mountain and Cold weather Training Base. Gunny quickly mastered many skills and became an instructor in mountain climbing, cold weather survival, skiing, combat in cold



weather and mountainous terrain, and later at 29 Palms for training in desert terrain and multiple weapons systems. Gunny has been stationed across the U.S. and deployed around the world on multiple missions as well as to international hot spots such as Beirut Lebanon, Mogadishu Somalia, etc. Gunny's extensive career was vast and multifaceted with never a dull moment. Upon retirement from the Marine Corps Gunny began another career working for the **Cherokee County School** system until retirement. 


<u>Chaplains Corner</u> Carl Maxwell



while providing resources to those who may be able to help save the life of a veteran.

North Carolina Veterans Council

Approved Legislative Priorities 2022 – 2023 NCVC, with collaboration and deliberation of members of its Legislative Committee, proposes these legislative initiatives (in no particular order of preference) to better synergize our collective efforts to influence, guide and affect improvements for NC Military, Veterans & their families.

SHORT TERM INITIATIVES (More immediate in nature): A) The establishment of Veterans Treatment Courts in ALL NC counties & jurisdictions, and the increase of funding to adequately address Veterans

Suicide Prevention programs at local community levels. B) Veterans, Military & Spouse preferences for NC State Licensing Compacts; similar to recent passage of HB 791 for Licensed Counselors Compact, proper licensing agreements / compacts for professional services remove employment barriers for military families; And... NC State Veterans, Military Spouse employment preferences to better mirror Federal preferences; such preferences should be considered for employment at our state levels commensurate with Federal guidelines.

C) Adjustments & Improvements to NC Property Tax language and exclusions – update language to reflect current 38 CFR guidance for Veterans / Widows:

This requires only a technical change to the NC General Statutes, and subsequent eligibility updates on the NCDVA Form 9. There are many surviving spouses across North Carolina who are negatively impacted financially because the NC General Statue does not conform with current 38 CFR eligibilities for VA Dependency & Indemnity Compensation (DIC). The current property tax exclusion up to the first \$45,000.00 valuation for a 100% disabled Veteran does not properly account for current economic impact, and completely ignores other Veterans with significant disability ratings (like HB 1076 / SB 821).

D) Fully fund the NC Department of Military & Veterans Affairs at levels allowing complete and adequate staffing, management,

maintenance and provided care in the state Veterans homes (like HB 772), state Veterans cemeteries, and war Veterans scholarship programs (like HB 767):

This includes proper establishment of a state cemetery trust fund, and necessary capital to acquire additional properties for expansion of existing cemeteries, and / or creation of new state cemeteries. This will require 6 new full-time employees, but these positions will be fully funded by cemetery receipts. Proposed language allows the Veterans Cemeteries Trust Fund to be used for maintenance and operations of the state veterans' cemeteries and directs responsibility to the Secretary of the Department, eliminating the annual distribution from the Veterans Home Trust Fund to the Cemetery Trust Fund and creates additional funding sources.

E) The creation of specific programs and support for Military Sexual Trauma (MST) veterans who have suffered that abuse. Pressure support to modify existing laws, more effectively sentencing during the punishment phase those found guilty of committing the sexual assaults. F) Increase pressure on our elected officials to quit delays on HB 746; pass this legislation concerning the respectful placement of the POW / MIA flag on state buildings and schools.

LONG TERM INITIATIVES (deliberate in nature): These priorities may include Legislation that did not survive previous considerations, or items that will need presentation to a member of the North Carolina General Assembly for the creation of a Bill to support the issue(s):

LT Priority #1 - Ask the Question DoD campaign LT Priority #2 – Toxic exposures effects in Veterans' dependents / children LT Priority #3 – Veterans' homelessness / Affordable Housing / Gender specific issues LT Priority #4 -NCNG Pension Survivors Benefits Plan LT Priority #5 – Coast Guard members payment authority equal to other branches of service LT Priority #6 -Hunting / Fishing Permits cost reduction for eligible Veterans LT Priority #7 – Improvements to SAD / USPHS / NOAA (These are numbered for recognition only, but are not intended to be addressed in any particular order)
