

necessary equipment where it needed to be.




A Thank You should be given as well to the Hayesville School and their Veteran's



WWII VETERANS

Kenneth Woodard, William "Bill" Daily, Robert "Bob" Epperson, Harry P. Rogers

Mr. Kenneth Woodard, now



101, served two tours as a Navy Seabee in the Southwest Pacific with a Naval Construction Battalion. The term "Seabees" is derived from "CB" or Construction Battalion. The Seabee's labored tirelessly in building infrastructure, airstrips, roadways, electrical, etc. while fellow troops continued to secure the island objectives. Kenneth was on several islands in the Pacific including the famed killing fields of Iwo Jima. Mr. Kenneth, as with all his comrades left their

indelible mark in winning the World's most horrific war. Mr. Kenneth was awarded the WWII Victory Medal, American Campaign Medal, Navy/USCD Unit Commendation Ribbon, and Combat Action Ribbon.

Mr. William (Bill) Dailey, now



age 98, served in WWII in the South Pacific. Being assigned to the 164th Infantry Division, Company A. Enjoying an early Thanksgiving Dinner, Bill met up with two other Clay County residences assigned to other units deployed to the South Pacific, Max Anderson and Clay Rogers. On Christmas Day the 164th Division landed on Bougainville in the Solomon Islands relieving the Third

Marine Division that had established two beachheads Bill's Division filled into the Marine's fox holes while the enemy pounded them with artillery shelling in the thick jungle. After Bougainville, Bill's unit was shipped to Leyte in the Philippians and later to the Island of Cebu, then shipped into combat on Negros Island. Bill was wounded on Negros and after recovery, his unit was shipped back to Cebu for Amphibious training in preparation for the invasion of mainland Japan. Bill was awarded many medals including a Bronze Star and the Purple Heart.

Mr. Robert (Bob) Epperson,




joined the Navy at the age of 15 with his parent's permission. This is when his adventures in

life really began. Completing basic training in Jacksonville, FL. He was assigned as a cook at Bunnell's galley in Daytona Beach for two years which relieved some of the older men for overseas duty. Robert was offered the rank of a Second-Class Petty Office if he would take a test and "ship out overseas". However, WWII ended and Robert had enough points to be discharged from military service and he chose to be discharged at the Rank of Fist Class Seamen. Robert then joined the Merchant Marines, serving most of his enlistment assigned to the SS Florida where he was in charge of operating the ship's galley, sailing the high seas. Completing his enlistment in the

Merchant Marines, he returning home, and enrolled in a local high school and then on to college.

Mr. Harry P. Rogers



Harry in the coming shade of age 95, served in the Navy some 20 plus years. Completing Basic Training, he received orders to the USS STORMES, (DD 780) and made two deployments to the Mediterranean Sea in 1946 / 1947 supporting two Carrier Battle Groups. He then received orders to the USS CAVALIER APA 37. Later, Harry was stationed overseas in Bangkok Thailand. When the Korean War began, in 1950, Harry received orders to the USS CARTER HALL, (LSD 3) Dock Landing Ship out of Hunters Point California for several years. Harry was then ordered to the USS BAYFIELD, APA 33, and made several deployments to support the troops in Korea. When the Vietnam war began Harry again made several deployments to Vietnam supporting our troops. During his career, Harry made many deployments to Korea, Vietnam and multiple South Pacific islands. Harry was assigned to the USS GRASP, ARS 24 homeported in Guam. Harry, sailing the seven seas. He retired as a First-Class Petty Officer, Quartermaster, Celestial Navigator, Signalman and Radar Operator. Harry certainly lived up to the old Navy saying, that "Sailors were made for ships and ships were made for the sea"; "Haze gray

and underway".

These gentlemen of the "Greatest Generation", defended the Democracies of this world, helped establish world peace and protected our freedoms and way of life. Our civilization owes a vast debt of gratitude to their sacrifice and service. Thank you, gentlemen, for "STANDING THE WATCH". It is a great honor to continue serving with you caring for Veterans and their families.
